A year of growth

2024 was a year of significant growth for us, particularly in expanding our partnerships in Richmond and beyond. We welcomed six new board members from diverse backgrounds, significantly improving our organizational capacity. This enabled us to extend our reach through formal partnerships with the National Medal of Honor Center for Leadership and the Congressional Medal of Honor Society. Additionally, we formed new collaborations with key Richmond institutions, including the Valentine Museum, Thomas Jefferson High School, the University of Richmond, Troutman Pepper Law Firm, the Virginia War Memorial, and VFW Post 6364.

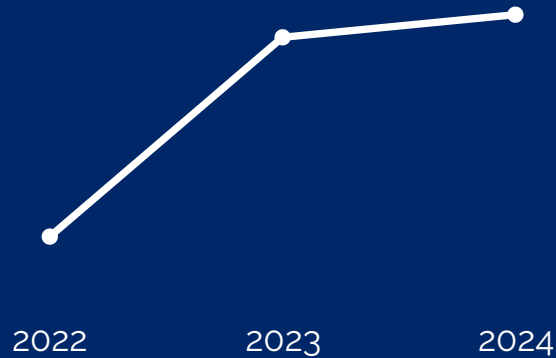

We partnered with the Richmond Mural Project and Ham Glass to paint a beautiful mural at 1903 W Main St. The mural celebrates 4 local heroes: George Street, Ernest Dervishian, Powhatan Beaty, and Jimmie Monteith.

We sponsored an art competition for local students. Congrats to Sydney Harrison, who claimed the \$500 top prize for her work, "Reflections of the Brave."
